**NPGA Rules to govern and take precedence over all others**

**Location:** In Corrales New Mexico 87048 at G.O. Horse Farm; 101 Larrabee Farm Road Corrales, NM 87048.

### **Fees:**

NMPGC Members \$8.00 per goat/class, \$10 per goat/class for non-members. Showmanship is free. There is a \$2 late fee per animal if registrations are postmarked after October 21st, 2017. Day of the show entries will not be accepted due to time constraints. Mail your entries to Dina Garcia at 9212 Guadalupe Trail NW Albuquerque, NM 87114. Showmanship will be held during the morning show only. All in-state exhibitors, please send a check with your entries.

### **Show Arrival:**

The arena will be available on Friday, October 27th, 2017 for set up. You can arrive on Saturday morning as well. Animals may stay on the grounds both Friday and Saturday night. Both shows will be on Saturday. Note: this is a private property. We want to be on our best behavior and follow directions from the owners. There is a bathroom on site.

### **Show Schedule:**

Check in will be on Friday, in afternoon, and again on Saturday beginning at 8:30 am. The show starts at 9:30 am. Please make sure you have your paperwork in early. All paperwork for both shows will need to be completed and entries paid for before you enter the ring. It is your responsibility to make sure you've entered your animals in the correct classes. Once a goat enters a class it cannot be shown in another afterward. This is per NPGA Rules.

### **Animal Identification and Paperwork:**

All animals must have original NPGA registration papers or have a bill of sale that is postmarked less than 90 days before the show date as well as the original registration certificate. Any animal that has won a Grand or Reserve Grand Championship must have a legible tattoo or working microchip in order to record the win. The judge will have the final say whether a win is recorded or not. Don't forget to check your microchips/tattoos beforehand so that you don't lose a win!

**Pens:**

You will need to bring your own travel pens to unload animals. If you choose to keep them in your trailer, that's okay as well. All parking will be directed by the owners. Please be patient, & they will fit you in. We are sharing a road next to a neighboring property and cannot trespass on it. All pens will be placed in the arena. There, you can set up anywhere you'd like. In the past, for a fee, stalls have been available in the barn across the way. Stall availability will be determined closer to the show date. Please note that there will not be a livestock guardian dog present. There is however a guard donkey. That being said, overnight in your trailer is still recommended.

**Sick Animals:**

Any animals deemed ill by the NMPGC Executive Board, or contracted judges, will be withdrawn from the competition. Refunds will not be given. Please do not bring sick animals.

**Hotels:**

Howard Johnsons (505) 892-1700, Days Inn (505) 892-8800, Comfort Inn (505) 892-5998, Hilton Garden (505) 898-1111. All are within 5 miles of the show's location. You can also pick a hotel in Albuquerque close to Alameda for easy access to Corrales. If you choose a hotel in Rio Rancho you will want to use the North access to Corrales, as it is closest to the arena! Otherwise take the Southern entrance into Corrales.

**Meals and Raffle Corner:**

The location of our Friday night dinner is still to be determined. The club may have water and sodas available for sale the day of the show, & we will have a long lunch break, most likely in Rio Rancho. Saturday night we'll have our good-bye dinner at a yet to be determined restaurant. We hope you can join us!

We need your raffle items. Please help support the club by bringing something to donate for the raffle table. All monies go towards having the next show. Please support the club in order for us to provide future shows for you!

**Directions:**

The venue is in Corrales, NM which is a small agricultural community between Albuquerque and Rio Rancho. Coming from the west or north of town, head to Rio Rancho Hwy 528. Old maps call it Pat D'Arco Hwy. Coming from the East or South of town. Take I-40 West to I-25 North to the Alameda exit and follow the signs to Corrales. If you miss the turn off to Corrales on the South side just stay on Alameda heading west as it will turn into Hwy 528 taking you into Rio Rancho, and wind you around to the North exit of Corrales. Call Renee with any problems or needing directions.

Once you enter Corrales (south side), stay on Corrales Road heading north almost to the end of the village, which is only about six miles long. Turn left west on Paseo Cesar Chavez. You can only go left!!! Ahead of you, you will see the tall covered horse arena and barns. Most of the land around it is vacant. You can't miss it.

If you're staying in Rio Ranch take Hwy 528, go north to the Corrales exit on your right-heading East. Then turn right at Paseo Cesar Chavez. It is very close to the North end. Third right once you enter Corrales. Call Renee if you get lost. There are only two main through-fares thru Corrales, (Corrales Rd) & Loma Larga. Don't turn on other roads as you'll get lost and not all go thru. Get a Google map, & it's a really easy trip.
